Personal data are also processed on the basis of legitimate interest, for example, in marketing, stakeholder collaboration, and customer relationship management.

7. What Kind of Information About Me is Processed?

The registry may contain the following personal data of individuals involved in the project, partners, and stakeholders: name, age, job title or role, employment status, educational background, phone number, email address.

8. From Which Sources are My Data Collected?

Personal data are collected from public sources such as organizations' websites, from the registered individuals themselves, and during various events, activities, or trainings organized by the project.

9. Will My Personal Data be Disclosed to Third Parties?

Data from the registry will not be disclosed to third parties.

Xamk may use external data processors (e.g., companies providing IT services such as Microsoft) who process personal data in accordance with agreements made. All reasonable measures are taken in the project to ensure that inaccurate, erroneous, or outdated personal data are promptly corrected or deleted for the purposes of processing.



10. Are My Data Processed Outside the EU or EEA?

No, they are not processed.

Storage space in Microsoft cloud services (Teams and OneDrive) is used at Xamk. Microsoft primarily processes data within the EU/EEA and in regional data centers. 11. How Long Will My Data Be Retained?

Personal data are retained for the duration of the project and as long as there is a continued need for their use. In project activities, personal data are retained according to the archiving period required by the funders. Project materials and documents that may contain personal data are archived for 10 years according to Xamk's practice

12. How Are My Personal Data Protected?

Data are stored in a data system. Users have personal user accounts. Only those data controllers who are authorized for their work have access to and use the data. Customer and stakeholder data are stored in a customer relationship management system, where data maintenance is protected by an AD account and password. Data stored in the system are accessible only to a restricted group with user rights within the registry.In ESR+ projects, participant data collection is conducted using the EURA2021 system, as mandated by Law 757/2021 (Act on the Financing of Regional Development and EU Structural Policy Projects). No other systems or separate paper forms are used for collecting participant data. The collection of this information follows the data protection practices of the EURA2021 system.
